## Pupil Progress and Attendance Information

We believe that it is important to keep parents and carers fully informed about the progress that their child is making at school. You will soon be receiving a letter outlining the assessment band that your child is currently working at for the end of Term 2 and their end of year targets. There will be information on the letter to show you whether your child is on track to achieve the expected standard by the end of the year. This letter will also include attendance figures for the first two terms. If you have any questions following this information please do not hesitate to speak to your child’s class teacher.

## Severe Weather Condition

We will always attempt to keep our school open if at all possible when there is severe weather.

In the unlikely event that our catering team would be unable to provide a school meal, parents would be informed via the website and a text message at the earliest opportunity. Parents would then need to provide a packed lunch. Don’t forget suitable warm clothing – gloves, hats, scarves, wellies etc. or even a change of clothing.



## Packed lunches



Please ensure that your child’s lunch box is clearly named. We would ask that you provide a drink (not fizzy) with their lunch, avoiding cans and containers which might leak or **flasks containing hot drink or food**. Can I remind you neither peanut butter/chocolate spread nor sweets are allowed. Crisps, biscuits and other such treats should also be kept to a minimum. Please ensure to include a spoon if your child has a yoghurt etc.

To help us protect our children please can we ask you to cut grapes and cherry tomatoes lengthways or into quarters, to avoid choking.

## Spare Clothes

As all children may need a change of clothes for different reasons, we need to keep a good supply of spare pants and trousers in school. If you have any unwanted tights, socks or tracksuits bottoms, especially boys’ clothes, we would be very grateful to have them in Foundation Stage. Also, if school lends your child clothes, please return them as soon as possible. Thank you

A BIG thank you goes out to the Principals Catering kitchen staff, Maggie and her team, who produced an excellent Christmas dinner last week, catering for 630 pupils and staff! The food was absolutely delicious and there was a very festive atmosphere in the dining hall.

### **Job Vacancies**

We currently have a vacancy for a **Midday Meals Supervisor** working 10 hours a week to support our children at lunchtime. The hours are from 11.20am to 13.20pm, 5 days a week, term time only (38 weeks per year). The pay is approximately £7.50 per hour, or £3,311 per annum pro rata.


We also have a vacancy for a **Cleaner** for 11.25 hours per week. The hours are 6.30am to 8.45am, Monday to Friday, 42 weeks per year (term time, INSET days, one week in the Easter break, first and last weeks of the summer break). The pay for this role is set at Kent Range 2 which is approximately £7.50 per hour, or £4,085 per annum pro rata.

### **Every Minute Counts**

Every time your child is late to school their progress could drop in ALL subjects!

Please work with us to give your child the best chances of learning by ensuring they are on time every day.

 <b>LATENESS = LOST LEARNING</b> (Figures below are calculated over a school year)	
5 minutes late each day	3 days lost!
10 minutes late each day	6.5 days lost!
15 minutes late each day	10 days lost!
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost!
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost!

Tips to help you and your child make going to school easier:

1. Help them to get their school bag ready the night before.
2. Make sure you have their uniform ready especially after the weekend or holidays.
3. Get them to bed at a reasonable time so they have a good night's sleep.
4. Make sure they have a good breakfast.
5. Remind them to set off for the bus or start walking early enough so they won't be late. **Punctuality is important!**
