Term one's theme is 'The Seasons'. The children are going to be exploring the school to find signs of Autumn. They will be learning Harvest festival stories and songs and performing them to the rest of the school and to parents. In Science the children will be learning to observe and measure rainfall, the wind and temperature. They will also be learning the days of the week and months of the year.

The Theme in Term 2 is 'The Local Area'. We will be ex-

and going for a walk around Garlinge to find different types of houses. We will also be learning about different kinds of materials in Science. At the beginning of November we will be finding out about the story of Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder plot.

#### Year 2

During Terms I and 2 we are studying famous people and events, these include: The Great Fire of London and Jesus.

The children will be studying aspects of peoples lives during these periods using the internet to find research, learn about the important historical events of the times and improve their geographical skills such as map work. Art and DT will also be included within by doing activities such as recreating the streets of London, baking bread and studying artists from the different periods of time.

In Science we will be looking at everyday uses of materials. We will look at the different types of materials and if they are man-made or natural. We will be grouping materials, separating materials and looking carefully at freezing, melting and heating.
