With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, we'll be presenting an <u>assembly</u> to the children on <u>Monday 9th October</u> as well as a leading <u>workshops</u> for <u>Year 5 on Monday 16th October</u> and <u>Year 6 on Thursday 19th October</u> focussing on the information below.

Talking about the Underwear Rule with your children
