Dear Parents & Carers

I hope that you all had a good half term break and are ready for the challenges ahead as we move towards Easter. Thank you all very much for helping the children prepare for the recent Olympic athlete visit. Luke was very impressed with the efforts, perseverance and behaviour of all the children and they were equally impressed to see him in action and hear about his accomplishments. A very big thank you goes to Mrs Davey who spent a lot of time organising the day.

Could I please ask that all parents who drive to Garlinge take a little more care over how they are using the roads in and around the school. Whilst we understand the need for children to be at school and on time every day, I have had more and more complaints about inconsiderate driving, which could lead to one of our children being hurt or seriously injured. We are working with the local police and Thanet District Council to make the roads as safe as we can, but we do still rely on the good sense of our parents on their journeys to school. We greatly appreciate those who park a little further away from school and take a healthy walk for the last few hundred metres – please consider this healthy option if you don't already!

We are also heading towards the part of the year where some of our children (years 2 and 6) are taking part in statutory tests (or SATs). Please ensure that your child is at school every day as we head towards these important tests, and look out for the extra information that we will be giving you, particularly as there have been a number of changes to these tests this year after the introduction of the 2014 National Curriculum. #### Road Safety

We have noticed an increase in the number of cars parked on the pavement around the gate by the KS1 entrance and Nursery. We would like to remind parents **not** to park here and that there should



be **no parking at any time of the day** in the staff carparks. Parking all around the premises needs to be considerate of our neighbours and the law – regular patrols by a Traffic Warden have resulted in several parking tickets being issued – **beware.** 

Please do not let your children walk across the school car parks, it is **DANGEROUS!** 

If you do have to drive your child to school please park in a safe place away from the entrance and:

- Keep the bus and taxi layby clear
- Drive at a suitable speed in case children run onto the road
- Meet your children at the School gate and walk them safely to your car
- Please use the recommended crossing paths with the Road Crossing Patrol
