School Start and Finish Times

Pupils are reminded to arrive at school by 8.45am where they go straight into class, and have quiet time where they can read or finish school work. Pupils that arrive late **must** report, with their parent, to the school office and give the reason for their lateness, which is recorded.

Why it is not good for children to be late:

- They walk into a class being very noticeable by their peers and this can socially isolate them.
- They are missing important education
- It disrupts the other children in the class with their learning.
- Lateness teaches poor time keeping which may impact on them in later life

In the afternoons, the gates are opened at 3.00pm – please collect you child at 3.10pm for KS1 pupils and at 3.15pm for KS2 pupils.

There seems to be an increasing number of children being collected from the main school office at the end of the school day and this is causing us concerns for the children's safety. The staff in the school office are not able to watch every child as it is a very busy time and this may increase the chances of difficulties when children are being picked up late.

We would like to remind parents that there is **no access** through the Westfield Road office entrance to the playgrounds for dropping off and collection of children.

School Meals and Universal Free School Meals

Principals Catering would like to remind parents of children in Years 3 to 6 that school meals **MUST** be paid for **IN ADVANCE**. This has to be on the child's first school day of the week, for all of the days that the child needs to have a meal provided. It is not possible to pay daily. If your child does not pay at the beginning of the week, you will be contacted and asked to provide a packed lunch.

School dinners are £2.15 per day, £10.75 per week.

If you think that your child is eligible for free school meals, please apply on-line:

www.kent.gov.uk/education-and-children/schools/free-school-meals

(or pick up an application form from the school office if you do not have on-line access). Our office staff are able to assist you if necessary.

Parents/guardians who receive any of the following benefits are entitled to Free School Meals:

- •Income Support
- •Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- •Child Tax Credit (not including Working Tax Credit) if the household income is below £16,190
- •Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- •an income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- •support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 if you are an asylum seeker This applies to all pupils from Foundation Stage through to Year 6. If you have any queries, please don't hesitate to contact the School Office.

Responsible Parking

This new KCC scheme is an initiative to make us all stop and think about how we drive and park around the school.



As a driver you have a responsibility to park in a safe and considerate manner, if you don't you could be endangering a child's life.

Please park with care and help make the area near and around our school a safer place for pupils.

If it is necessary to park on the roads around our school, remember:

- No parking on single or double yellow lines
- No double parking
- No stopping, dropping or parking on the School Keep Clear yellow zig zags
- No parking on corners or junctions especially near the school entrances
- Please do not block driveways

Following these rules will not only improve the safety of the area surrounding our school, it may also avoid you receiving a parking ticket!
