
What do the big hands and the small hands on a clock mean? Discuss ideas. The big hand on the clock is called the minute hand, it tells us how many minutes past or to the next hour. The small hand on the clock is called the hour hand, this tells us which hour it is. How many hours in a day? How many minutes in an hour?

Today, we are going to be learning about telling the time to o'clock. When the minute hand (big hand) is pointing to the 12, the time is something o'clock.



If we look at this clock. The hour hand (small hand) is pointing to the 9 and the minute hand (big hand) is pointing to the 12. So, the time on this clock is 90'clock.



Recap from yesterday - what do the big hands and the small hands on a clock mean? The big hand on the clock is called the minute hand, it tells us how many minutes past or to the next hour. The small hand on the clock is called the hour hand, this tells us which hour it is.


Today, we are going to be learning about telling the time to half past. When the minute hand (big hand) is pointing to the 6, the time is showing half past the hour. The minute hand has travelled half way around the clock from the 12.



If we look at this clock. The hour hand (small hand) is half way between the 3 and 4, it has gone past 3 but not yet on 4. The minute hand (big hand) is pointing to the 6. So, the time on this clock is half past 3.

How would you draw the hands to show these times? To show half past 1, I would need to draw the minute hand pointing to the 6 and the hour hand half way between 1 and 2. To show half past 10, I would need to draw the minute hand pointing to the 6 and the hour hand half way between 10 and 11.




Quarter to 1

If we look at this clock. The minute hand (big hand) is pointing to the 9 and the hour hand (small hand) is nearly on the 1. So, the time on this clock is a quarter to 1.



Recap on time so far - what do the big hands and the small hands on a clock mean? The big hand on the clock is called the minute hand, it tells us how many minutes past or to the next hour. The small hand on the clock is called the hour hand, this tells us which hour it is. If the minute hand is pointing to the 12, it is o'clock. If the minute hand is pointing to the 6, it is half past. If the minute hand is pointing to the 3, it is a quarter past. If the minute hand is pointing to the 9, it is quarter to (the next hour).

Today, we are going to be learning about hours and our day. How many seconds are there in a minute? How many minutes in and hour? How many hours in a day? There are 60 seconds in a minute, 60 minutes in an hour and there are 24 hours in a day.

If the time is 4 o'clock, what would the time be 60 minutes earlier? An hour earlier would be 3 o'clock. What would the time be 30 minutes later? Half an hour later would be half past 4.


