


Last week we looked at 'ai' sound from phase 3. For this lesson we are looking at the 'ay' sound from phase 5. These sounds are said the same way but are written differently!

When we take away on a number line we count back from the largest number.

Eg 15 – 2 = 13
We would count back
"fourteen, thirteen"
17 – 3 = 14
We would count back

"sixteen, fifteen, fourteen"

We can us a numberline to

do this.

Remember to set the level to subtraction within 20 minus a single digit.

You will need paper, pencils and paint.






Drawing is lots of fun and is a great way to be creative!

It looks like this:




Let's start by playing a counting game. With Whack a Mole you can count up and count down. Please help your child to count up from 1 to 20 and then back down from 20 to 1.

Over the last week and this week your child has been learning about addition and taking away. Today we are going to be learning that addition and subtraction are related. We can link an add to a take away. They will use the same numbers.

We can look at an addition calculation like this:



12 + 1 = 13

This uses the same numbers as this take away calculation:

$$13 - 1 = 12$$

Once Geraldine has said the 'oy' sound please pause the video and see how many times you can write the 'oy' sound in 2 minutes.


Once you have done this, continue with the video.


