

### Supervision at pick up time

We would like to remind you that once you have picked up your child from their class teacher at the end of the day, you must keep your children with you and leave the site promptly to ensure that they are safe and fully supervised. We are finding more and more children playing after school unsupervised on the timber trails and playground equipment which is a safety concern. We are also finding children becoming separated from their adults and not being able to find them once they have been collected from school. Thank you for your assistance with this.

### **Personal Property**

At the end of every school term we have a large amount of unnamed and unclaimed items of personal property. Please can you ensure that you label all articles of clothing and personal belongings clearly with your child's name e.g. uniform, lunchbox, water bottle. Please can we remind you that your child should NOT bring any personal belongings into school.

Also, when walking children to school ensure that you use the footpaths provided and do not cut through car parks. We have had several incidents recently which could have resulted in an accident.

Please also do not leave your parked vehicle unattended with the engine running or leave your vehicle engine running unnecessarily while your vehicle is stationary. **We all need to work together to ensure the safety of our children.**
