


doing this using dienes squares. Remember we had long stacks of ten and then we had cubes of one;



In this number we have 1 stack of ten and 3 ones so the number it represents is the number 13. If we wanted to find one more than this number we would add one more cube, like this



If we count the cubes now we still have 1 stack of ten but now we have 4 ones. So, one more than 13 is 14.





If you remember, yesterday we had some dienes squares and we were working out how many we had and then adding one more. Today we are going to use dienes squares to find one less.



If we use this number we have 1 stack of ten and 3 ones so the number it represents is the number 13. If we wanted to find one less than this number we would need to cross one cube out, like this



If we count the cubes now we still have 1 stack of ten For this lesson we will be learning the 'ph' sound. To warm up your brains see how many Phase 3 sounds you can remember by playing the Flashcard game

Now let's learn our new sound. Today we are learning the 'ph' digraph. This can be found in words such as;

- Elephant
- Phone
- Phonics
- Dolphin

Watch the video below and see what words Geraldine the Giraffe will find with the 'ph' digraph in.

Once Geraldine has said the sound, pause the video and write the 'ph' sound as many times as you can in 2 minutes! They can be as big or as small as you want!

Once you have done this, continue with the video.

We have four seasons throughout the year. In the Autumn we looked at the weather and how it was changing. Can you remember what the different seasons are called and what the weather is like for each one? What order do the seasons come in?

Watch the video about seasons and how they change. While you are watching it think about the weather and the different things we see in each season.

Today we are going to look at comparing different groups of objects. To do this we are going to use three terms we have used before; 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'. First of all, practice finding more than and less than with the Mucky Monsters game

**LI:** To know onomatopoeic words.

## Equipment needed:

You will need a pencil and some paper.



Today we are going to learn all about a special type of word that we might see in some stories. Firstly, warm up your brains by practicing writing your name 5 times. Are all of your letters the right way around? Can you remember how to write your name in pre-cursive handwriting, with the lead in and lead out?

Sometimes the words we say are 'sound words' which means they sound like the word you are using. For example, 'squelch' sounds like the noise your shoe might make if you squelched in some sticky mud. Or if someone ran past you super-fast they might make the sound 'whoosh'. The posh word for this is a very tricky word indeed. It is onomatopoeia.

In the first group we have 11 circles, in the second group there are 12 circles. This means that the first group has less than the second group.



In this example the first group has 13 circles and the second group has 10. This means that the first group is greater than the second group.

If both groups had the same amount of circles the first group would be equal to the second group.

Now try using this method to work out if the first box of circles is 'greater than', 'less than' or 'equal to' the second box of circles on the worksheet. You can find this on the resources page. Here is a video to explain:





using the terms 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'. We had to count each box carefully and work out if the first box had more, less or the same circles as the second box.

Today we are going to be drawing our own objects in one of the boxes. To do this we need to look at each problem carefully.



In this example we know the first box contains 3 circles. We also know that the first box has less than the second box. This means that we need to draw a number that 3 is less than, this could be 4, 5, 6 etc.



Now if I read this problem back it says that 3 is less than 4.

Let's try another example.



In this problem we can see the first box has 5 circles and that it is greater than the rds-time-challenge (Phase 3)

Now let's go on to some addition sentences. When we write an addition sentence we use numbers and symbols; today we are going to need to use our + sign and our = sign.

Play the Mental Maths Train Game and choose addition up to 25. Try to work out the number sentences and answers using numberlines or 100 squares.

For example, this picture is asking us to add 4 and 10 together. We would write this as 4 + 10 = \_\_. Now we need to find the answer so I would find the number 4 on my numberline and jump forward 10 jumps – remember to count the jumps and not the numbers!

I landed on the number 14 so my number sentence would be 4 + 10 = 14.
