#### A Message from the Chairs of Governors

As you will know, since September 2018 *Garlinge* has joined with St Mildred's Primary Infant School and Bromstone Primary School in a co-operative educational trust called the **Thanet Endeavour Learning Trust** (**TELT**). We have worked together for many years with these schools and our other partners in the trust, Canterbury Christ Church University, Laleham Gap School, Turner Contemporary and Manor House Forest School. As governors we see this formal collaboration as a great opportunity to enhance the educational opportunities of our pupils without changing the character of our individual schools.

The staff of the schools have had regular training sessions with each other as have the governors but now there is the chance for the pupils to meet each other in activities other than sport and they are working towards an outdoor learning project to officially launch the trust next term. There will also be the opportunities for the parents of our schools as stakeholders to meet in an educational forum and we shall be letting you know further details in the near future.

#### **Buses**

We are aware that there have been problems regarding bus travel recently with buses being full and arriving late. It has also been brought to our attention that there have been conflicts between some Hartsdown students and Garlinge parents. Sixth form students from Hartsdown visited Garlinge recently to discuss this matter further. They are currently undertaking a project to address behavioural issues. This involves liaising with Stagecoach to provide larger and more frequent buses which should help the situation. The students will visit Garlinge again to present the results in due course.



In the meantime, could we please ask parents to consider their own behaviour when travelling to and from school with children. Please let us know if you experience any behavioural issues regarding Hartsdown students and we shall feed this back to the school.

### **Year 4 - Roman Britain Experience Day**



On <u>Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March</u>, Year 4 visited the Museum of Kent Life in Maidstone, to experience life during Roman Britain, which was linked to their ongoing topic learning. This was a fantastic opportunity for the children to engage in various exciting activities throughout the day and really experience what life would have been like during Roman Britain. Many of the children came wonderfully dressed as a Roman or a Celt, which certainly added to the experience and fun. During the day, the children had the opportunity to take part in a range of activities and workshops such as: 'Meet a Centurion', 'Celts and Druids', 'Building a better Britain', 'Amulet making', all while finding out what the Romans did for Britain. They even had the opportunity to meet Queen Boudicca! Despite the bad weather, all of the children and adults had a fantastic day and it was lovely for them to be able to be involved
