| Today we will be sharing the story — 'We're going on a bear hunt' by Michael Rosen You can find the video of the story here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0gyl6ykDwds However if you have your own, please feel free to share that.  Share the story with your child, pausing to ask them questions, for example: - Why do you think they want to find a bear? - Where might they look for a bear? - What would it feel like to walk through a river? - Would it be easy to walk through mud? You can find more questions and picture references in our pack. Talk about the key characters in the story (the family and the bear). With your child, can you draw the characters to make puppets? Use the puppets to retell the story. Encourage your child to talk about each event in the story. Talk about the settings. Can you find things to represent the different settings? | Use this counting video as a warm up to this session:  Today we are going to be focusing on finding one / two less than a number. You can use a variety of items to support this activity, ranging from pasta, Lego pieces to sweets. Support your child to count out an amount (either using a dice or online dice: <a href="https://www.online-stopwatch.com/chance-games/roll-a-dice/">https://www.online-stopwatch.com/chance-games/roll-a-dice/</a> )  Then ask your child to find one less, supporting them to take one away and talk them through the process. Model counting backwards one to find the same answer. You can also show them how you get the same answer using a number line by jumping backwards by one.  If your child is confident with this, move on to finding two less and then a mix up of each. | Today we are going to be taking part in yoga! So make sur you've got a space! # **Literacy**Clever Hands

#### Home learning focus:

To use a controlled movement

Today we are going to take part in Clever Hands activities. Ask your child if they can tell you what Clever Hands is and what it is for.

We do Clever Hands to build the strength and control in our fingers so we can do lots of different things with our hands.

You can find additional activities in our resource pack for this week on the home learning section of the website. Here you can also find recipes for making your own playdough.

Nursery Phonics – Share a picture of an alien – can you name the alien with an alliterative name? E.g. *Mig Mug Molly Mo or Ping Pang Po Pop*.

Reception Phonics – Recap your child's sounds and tricky words. Play Tricky Word Trucks. Select Phase 2 and 3 together.

Support your child to build the tricky words with their yellow sound cards (Phase 3 - they, all). Can they copy the word? Once they have it written, can they cover it and have a go at writing it by themselves?

#### Maths

#### Number / Shape Space and Measure

Tuesday

#### Home learning focus:

**Reception** – To explore subtraction

Ask your child to tell you what they did yesterday. Explain that they were finding less than and that they had to take away some items. Show your child the '—' symbol. Ask them what it means. Explain that is the subtraction sign and this means to take away. When we take away, the amount gets less, and we count what is left, which is what we did yesterday.

Explain to your child that we can take away lots of different amounts. Ask them to count out an amount above six (using the items from yesterday, or any others that you have) and then ask them to take away/subtract an amount generated from the roll of a dice. Encourage them to talk through what they are doing and how they find out what the answer is. You can model writing the number sentence for them as they tell you what they have done: 7-4=3. Talk them through the number sentence.

Nursery – To use the language of size

Today we are going to be using size words small/smallest and big/biggest. Support your child to give the bears the right sized clothing. Encourage them to talk about and describe the clothes and their sizes.

# **Literacy**Bears

#### Home learning focus:

To describe main events of the story

Share the story – 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen, once again.

You can find the video of the story here:

However if you have your own, please feel free to share that.

Talk about who is in the story, who are our main characters? What happens first? Next? Then? After? Last?
Support your child to recall the story, use visuals if needed.
Encourage your child to talk about each part in simple, clear sentences. Ask your child to draw a picture for each part of the story.

**Reception** – Support your child to use their sounds to write a key word for each part of the story, e.g. *grass, river*. If they are confident with their writing, can they write a sentence? E.g. *They went through the mud*.

Nursery - Adult to scribe.

#### Nursery Phonics - Digging for treasure

Collect two sets of objects suitable for use in a sand tray. Each set of objects must have names beginning with the same initial sound. Choose initial sounds for each set that sound very different from one another. Bury the objects in preparation for the session. As the children uncover the treasure, group the objects by initial sound and each time another is added recite the content of that set, e.g. Wow! You've found a car. Now we have a cup, a cow, a candle and a car.

**Reception Phonics** – Today we are going to be reading and matching captions. In the home learning pack you can find some pictures and captions from Phase 2. Support your child to blend and read the captions and identify the picture that it is referring to. If your child is confident with this they can have a go at the Phase 3 page.

## Wednesday

### **Maths** Number

#### Home learning focus:

**Reception** – To explore subtraction

Warm up with the subtraction game from yesterday. <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/subtraction/subtraction-to-10">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/subtraction/subtraction-to-10</a> Support your child to talk through what is happening, using the language of: <a href="mailto:subtract">subtract</a>, take away, less, equals.

Today we are going to be writing our own number sentences. Support your child to use the same technique as yesterday to generate their own number sentences to write. Guide your child through the structure as they undertake each part.

Nursery – To count accurately

Support your child to accurately count the items that the bear would like. Pause the video to allow your child time to count each plate and identify the correct amount.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

#### Home learning focus:

To manipulate materials to achieve a planned effect

Share the story – 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen, once again.

Today we are going to make our own bear cave. Encourage your child to talk about what might be in the cave for the bear and why. On your walk you could collect these materials to build your own cave.

Encourage your child to talk about what they are doing and why.





# **Literacy**Bears

#### Home learning focus:

To write in simple sentences / To talk in simple sentences

Talk about the story we have been sharing this week. (You can share it again if you'd like!)

Today we are going to imagine that we are searching for our own animal with your family. Ask your child questions to encourage/support their imaginations and creativity.

What animal are you searching for? What does it look like? Where are you going to search first? E.g. the park, the woods, the beach. What would that be like? What might you see there? What would you do when you found it? E.g. run away, become their friend, or hide? How do you think you would feel?

Encourage your child to use descriptive vocabulary whilst sharing their ideas, e.g. the big, green wood or a little, slimy frog.

**Reception** – Support your child to use their sounds to write a simple sentence, e.g., *I am going on a stripy, tiger hunt*.

Nursery – Adult to scribe.

#### Nursery Phonics – Bertha goes to the zoo

Set up a small toy zoo and join the children as they play with it. Use a toy bus and a bag of animal toys with names starting with the same sound (e.g. a lion, a lizard, a leopard, a llama and a lobster) to act out this story. Chant the following rhyme and have you and your child in turn draw an animal out of the bag and add an animal name to the list of animals spotted at the zoo.

Bertha the bus is going to the zoo, Who does she see as she passes through? ... a pig, a panda, a parrot and a polar bear.

Reception Phonics – This game is called Forest Phonics.
Follow the link and click on 'sh'. Support your child to sound out each word and move the correct graphemes to spell out the word.

### Thursday Maths

### Number

#### Home learning focus:

**Reception** – To solve subtraction number sentences

Warm up with the subtraction game from yesterday. <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/subtraction/subtraction-to-10">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/subtraction/subtraction-to-10</a> Support your child to talk through what is happening, using the language of: <a href="mailto:subtract">subtract</a>, take away, less, equals.

Today we are going to be reading and solving number sentences. You can write out your own short number sentences or use the one in the pack (choosing one depending on your child's confidence with this). Talk your child through the number sentence, reading each part and talking about what they have to do, e.g. 8 - 3 =  $\longrightarrow$  first we need to get 8 items, then we need to take away 3 and that equals what is left – and write the answer to finish the number sentence.

#### **Nursery** – To count accurately

The bears have escaped from the caves! Support your child to count them back in. If you are unable to print you can use the cave made from yesterday and make your own bears and numbers to complete this activity.

# **Literacy**Reading

#### Home learning focus:

To blend phonemes to read / To share stories with interest

Nursery – Share a story with your child. Ask them to tell you what they think might happen next and why? Can they identify the main character? Ask them to identify something in the picture. Can they tell you what happened in the story when it is finished? What was their favourite part?
