Children should attend school every day unless they are ill. When children are absent they miss vital parts of their education. If your child is going to be absent please inform the school office. The Curriculum

Year I

During Term 3, we found out about toys and games. We used different styles and techniques in Design and Technology to make toys and games.

In Science we found out about materials. We discovered and compared what old and new toys were made from by exploring their properties. We also designed and made toy cars and puppets.

In Term 4 we will be learning all about Landscapes. We will be finding out about our local environment, cliffs and different landscapes. They will be introduced to the work of Claude Monet, Vincent van Gogh, and Jean

Metzinger. They will think about the similarities and differences between work of the different artists. looking at the colours, painting styles, settings, and times of day. They will make drawings, paintings, mosaic art, inspired by the three artists.

In Science we will be looking at the seasons and observing weather changes.

Year 2

During Terms 3 and 4 we are studying famous people and events, these include: The Great Fire of London, Samuel Pepys' life and the differences between London now and then. The children will be studying aspects of peoples lives during these periods using the internet to find research. learn about the important historical events of the times and improve their geographical skills such as map work. Art and DT will also be included within our topic by doing activities such as recreating the streets of London, baking bread and studying artists from the different periods of time.

In Science we will be looking at everyday uses of materials. We will look at the different types of materials and if they are man-made or natural. We will be grouping materials, separating materials and looking carefully at their properties.



Homework

Help your child to learn and achieve their best by assisting them with their learning at home.

Every child should be reading on a daily basis. When your child has finished reading their book, and their reading record is signed by you, they can place it in a box within the classroom. It will then be changed so that you

Many children in Year 2 will receive spellings weekly. Year I will need to practice their reading word cards and sounds.

Home-School learning book. This will give you the opportunity to be involved with your child's learning. Further information can be found in your child's Home -School Learning book and Spelling Book.

Top Tip: When you read with your child ask them questions about the book. This will help their understanding and improve their reading. Please remember to sign your child's book each
