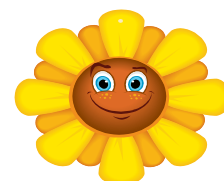

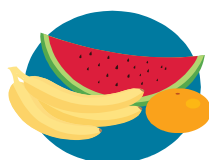

Physical Education

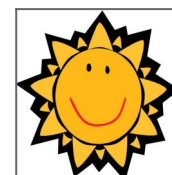
Help your children to be organised for PE;

1. Make sure your child always has a PE kit in school. This should consist of their house colour t-shirt, dark shorts and plimsolls for indoor PE and tracksuit bottoms and trainers for outdoor PE. Please make sure that all clothes are clearly named. and are the correct size (feet grow very quickly!)

2. Please ensure that any earrings are taken out for P.E days.

3. If your child takes part in an after school club requiring P.E kit please remember to bring your child's P.E kit back to school the next day.

As the Summer weather approaches please ensure your child has a named sun hat and that you apply sun cream to your child before school. The children can reapply this during the day and the staff will supervise this but we cannot apply the cream to the children. Please label your child's cream.

Punctuality

The KS1 doors open at 8:45am and this is a chance for your child to come into school and hang up their coat and take part in a learning activity before registration.

The register is taken at 8:55am, any child that arrives after this time will be marked as being late. When a child is late for school they miss out both socially and academically and feel they are not part of the lessons. We would ask that you ensure your child is

brought to school ready to start their day between 8:45 and 8:55am everyday. Every class with **100%** punctuality is rewarded weekly with a visit to the timber trail.

The Curriculum

Year 1

In Term 5 the children will be learning about Aliens and Space. They are going to be finding out about the planets in the Solar System and about the history of space flight. The children will be making up their own alien language and writing stories about aliens. In science the children will be finding out about plants and growth. The children will be identifying parts of plants and will be learning the names of different plants. In RE the children will be finding out about churches and the ceremonies that take place in churches.

During Term 6 the theme of the term will be learning about Animals and lifecycles. In science the children will be finding out about how animals and humans develop. They will be studying the life-cycles of mini-beasts. In RE they will be learning about Hinduism. They will also be learning new skills in PE and looking forward to Sports Day.

Year 2

In Term 5 we will be doing our SATs assessments but we will also be learning about the author Julia Donaldson. The children will be completing an author study where they will be focusing on all of her

famous texts.

In Science we will be continuing to learn about humans and living things and developing our investigative skills. Year 2 are really looking forward to visiting Wildwood to support their learning experiences.

During Term 6 we will be continuing to learn about our local area, with a focus on Dreamland and local buildings. We will be exploring our local area and thinking about ways to improve it. We will also be studying our environment and local habitats in Science which will include developing new habitats for wildlife around the school.



Homework

Help your child to learn and achieve their best by helping them with their learning at home.

Help them to practise their times tables and number bonds to 10 and 20 daily (two numbers that add up to 10 or 20).

Every child should be reading on a daily basis. Every Wednesday KS1 enter the **Buster's Book Club**

competition. **Please remember to record the number of minutes your child has read and sign your child's book mark.** This will enable your child to contribute greatly to this competition. Many children in Year 2 will receive spellings weekly. Year 1 will need to regularly practise their reading word cards and sounds.

Your child will be given a task to complete most weeks in their Home-School learning book. This will give you the opportunity to be involved with your child's learning.



Top Tip: When you read with your child ask them questions about the text. This will help their understanding and improve their reading.
