
# Welcome to our Upper Key Stage 2 Meet the Team Meeting

## **The Curriculum**

Each year group follows the National Curriculum statutory programmes of study for English, Mathematics, Science, ICT, Geography, History, Art, Music, Physical Education and Design Technology. Religious Education, PSHE and a Modern Foreign Language are also part of the school curriculum.

Some subjects are taught through a cross-curricular approach with History or Geography as lead subjects. For example:

## **Extra - Curricular**

♦ We have a broad range of clubs available at our school. These change termly, some have a small charge to cover costs for external providers.

We will keep you informed via school letters and will also speak to our classes about the clubs. Miss Tanner (in the school office) is responsible for the organisation of clubs and she will be more than happy to assist you with any queries.

#### **Expectations**

At the end of year 6 children will be assessed to see if they are working at the national expected level. Following the key stage two SATS tests, we will provide you with your child's assessed results and individual teacher assessments. These are also shared with secondary schools accordingly.

Targets will be shared with you throughout the year during meetings and discussions. We will inform you of where your child is at and where we expect them to reach throughout the course of the year and how we can successfully work together.

#### Targets

- Targets for reading, writing, maths and science are set termly and displayed in classes and on your child's books.
- These targets are shared at Parents Evenings.

#### **Assessment**

- ➤ Our assessment system helps us to assess our pupils in reading, writing, and maths. We use guidance from the local authority to track pupil progress and establish whether individual pupils are on track to meet their end of Key Stage requirements.
- ► We will make judgements using statements linked to each year group as to whether they are:
  - Emerging
  - Expected
  - Exceeding

#### **Communicating with Parents**

- Department newsletters sent home 3 times a year
- Regular school newsletters
- Parent Learning Afternoons throughout the year
- Curriculum workshops for parents e.g. Reading Workshop

- Any concerns make appointment with child's class teacher
- Parents' Evenings-A chance to discuss your child's progress
- Annual pupil reports
- Check for any letters/information sent home with children

## **Behaviour and Sanctions**

A high standard of behaviour is expected from all pupils to ensure that all pupils are happy and able to learn effectively.

#### **Rewards:**

- House points
- Class rewards
- Golden class book
- Opportunity to visit the Headteacher
- Learner of the week, Mathematician of the week, reader of the week, writer of the week and value of the week.

#### **Consequences of poor choices**

New positive behaviour ladders – do have a look when in the classrooms. Children aim for their name to remain on green or move up to silver and then gold.

If name moved down to orange and then red

- Time out in a partner class (10 minutes)
- Chance to settle back in class
- Oetention table
- Involvement of senior staff/ parents contacted.
- ♦ The children have the opportunity to move back up the ladder throughout the day.
