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Other activities for the week

Here are some other ideas for the week:

Mindfulness:

This week why not try going on a mindfulness adventure around your garden, house or even a park or beach! First, you choose a route you are going to walk slowly around. For example, walking one lap around your garden. Then you walk that route slowly two times. The first time you have to try and notice as many different things that you can see; a flower, a bug, a tree, the sky. The second time you need to focus on noticing all the different things you can hear; a bird, children playing nearby, cars, the wind. Try sitting still afterwards and closing your eyes and see if you can hear any sounds you didn't notice before, I bet you'll be surprised!




Well Being

<u>Art</u>

Why not get prepared for summer by making these amazing ice cream collages! Simply draw the cone and however many ice cream balls you want (circles), then stick brightly coloured pieces of paper on each part of the ice cream. Then stick them all together to create your very own summer treat!



Design and Technology:

How about making your very own dreamcatcher! All you need is two sticks / twigs and some brightly coloured wool. You cross the sticks over into an x and wrap the wool round the middle very tightly at first, keeping the sticks together (you may need an adult to help with this part as it can be tricky!). Then you wrap a circle of wool around one stick, then over the next stick, then the next and so on. Make sure your circle of wool always starts by going over the top of the stick and not under! If you want to change colours simply cut the wool you are using and tie your next colour to it, then carry on as before! You can then hang it up in your bedroom!



A fun way of segmenting and blending words is to play 'Obb and Bob'. Simply decorate two containers with alien faces and name one Bob, and one Obb. In the example below we have used small bins but you can use tubs, bowls or even just draw the two pictures yourself. An adult then writes lots of different words on separate pieces of paper, some real and some fake (alien words). Then, it's your job to sound these words out and decide which character will eat the word up. Bob loves real words and Obb only eats alien words! You can make the words as easy or difficult as you like!
