





# <u>Focus</u> – To write an interesting character description.

- Neat, cursive handwriting using pen or pencil.
- Correct use of punctuation, especially the correct use of capital letters, commas and full stops.
- Descriptive vocabulary, including adverbs and conjunctions.
- Using Roman key vocabulary.
- Remember to describe the soldier's appearance, behaviour, how he moves and sounds.

# <u>PSHCE</u>

# <u>Focus</u>: To listen and respond respectfully to a wide range of people.

Today we will be learning about how to listen and respond respectfully to a wide range of people, even when we do not agree with their opinions. We will discuss why it is important to listen to different points of views and recognise that it is important to take other people's feelings into consideration before responding to them.

It is ok to challenge points of views that we do not agree with, HOWEVER, this must be done in a respectful way. How can this be done?

- Should you shout at them?
- Should you tease them and tell them they're wrong?
- Should you make fun of their point of views?

Think about graffiti – some people have different viewpoints about it. Some people consider graffiti to be a form of art and a way to express a talent, just like a footballer, singer or film star.

# HOWEVER

Some people do not see graffiti as art but as vandalism. It may be considered as vandalism because people spray it all around the community and make areas look very messy. Some of it may have bad words or pictures. Is that really art?

Have a think about the different viewpoints and consider the argument you MOST agree with. Maybe you're 50/50 and can't decidethat's ok. The most important thing is considering all the different viewpoints before making up your mind.



# <u>Activity</u>

Use the sheet in the resources section to record the different viewpoints about whether graffiti is art or vandalism. For example, it can be considered art because some work can be sold for lots of money. There are famous graffiti artists such as Banksy who is as famous as David Beckham.

You may choose also to have a discussion about this at home and show respect for different opinions.

An adverbial is a word, phrase or clause that is used, like an adverb, to change a verb or a clause.



Adverbs can be used as adverbials, but many other types of words, phrases and clauses can be used in this way.

When adverbials are used at the beginning of a sentence, they are called '**fronted adverbials**'.
