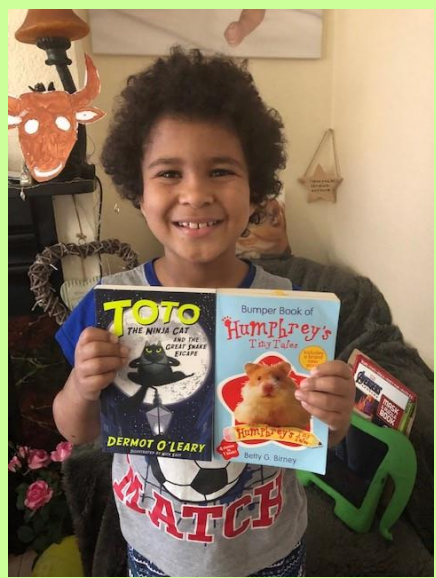

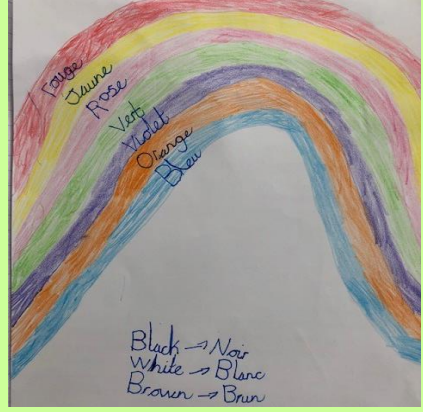
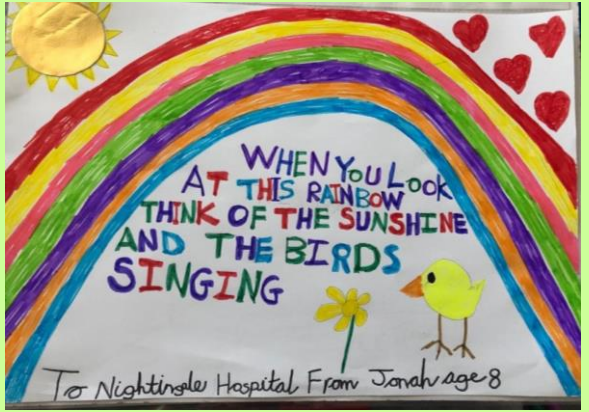

I can see...

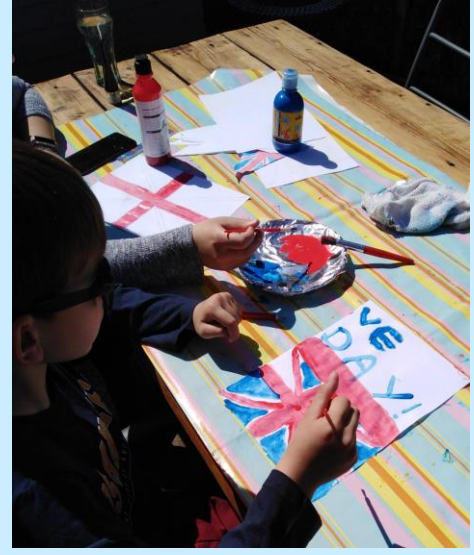

I can hear...

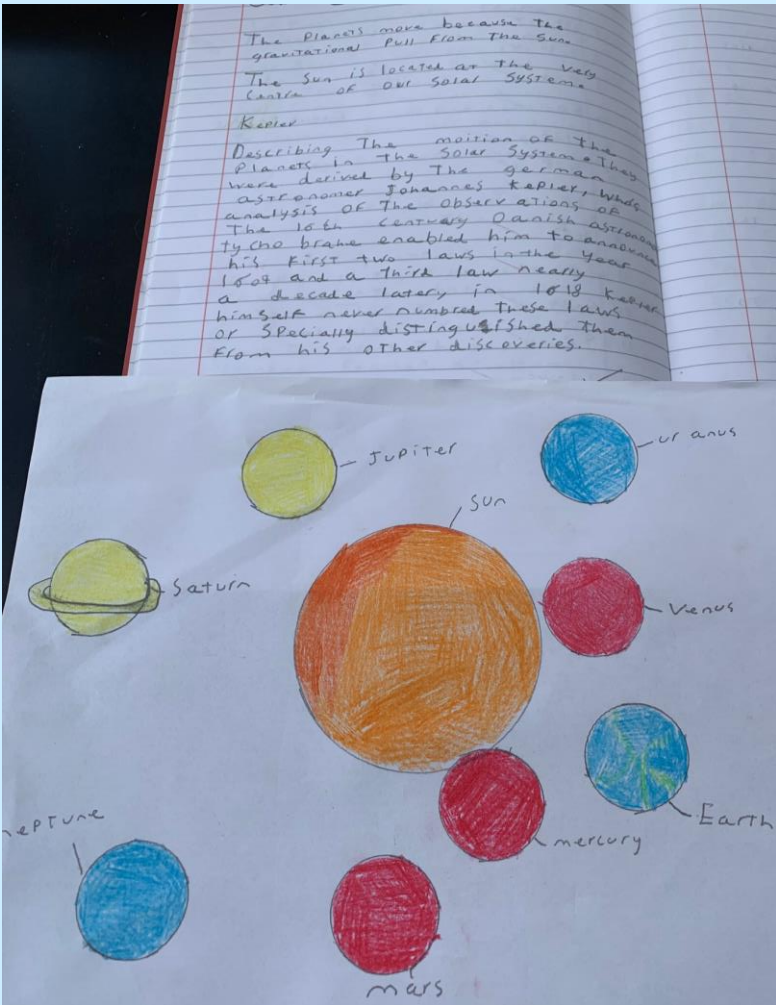

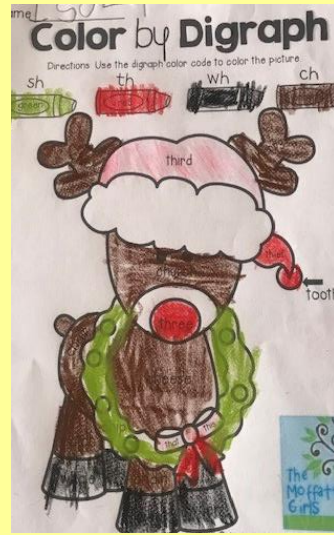


Logan Year 5,

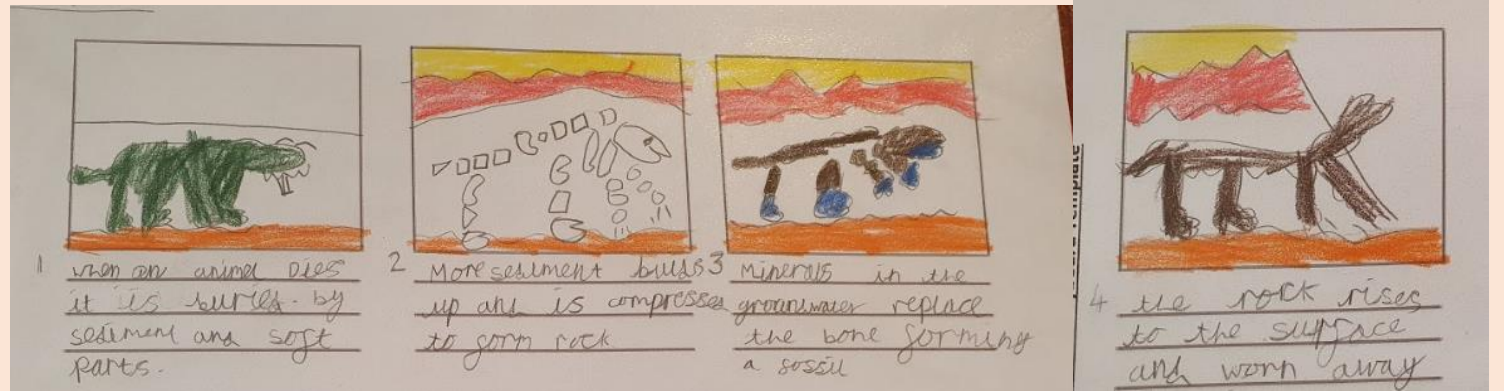

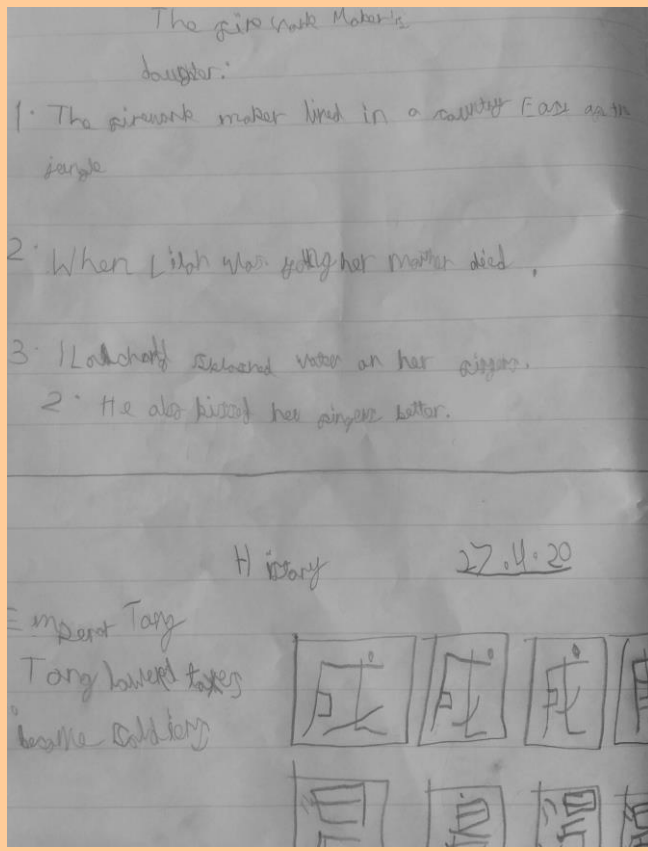

I will ride my box over the great expanse of the Sahara Desert.



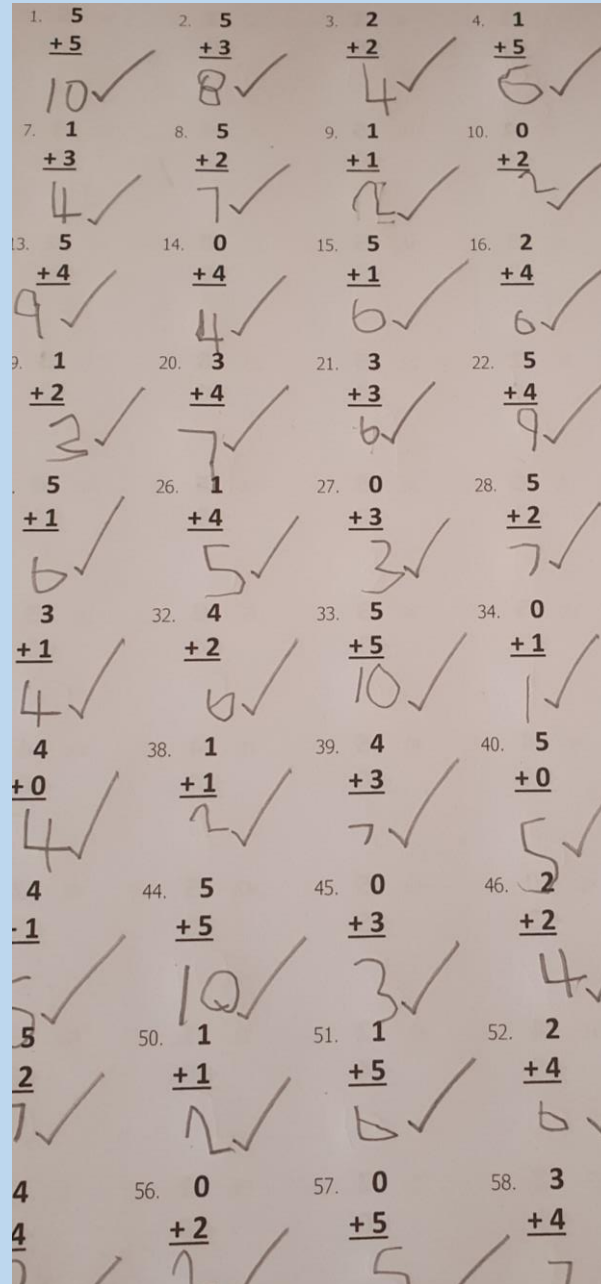
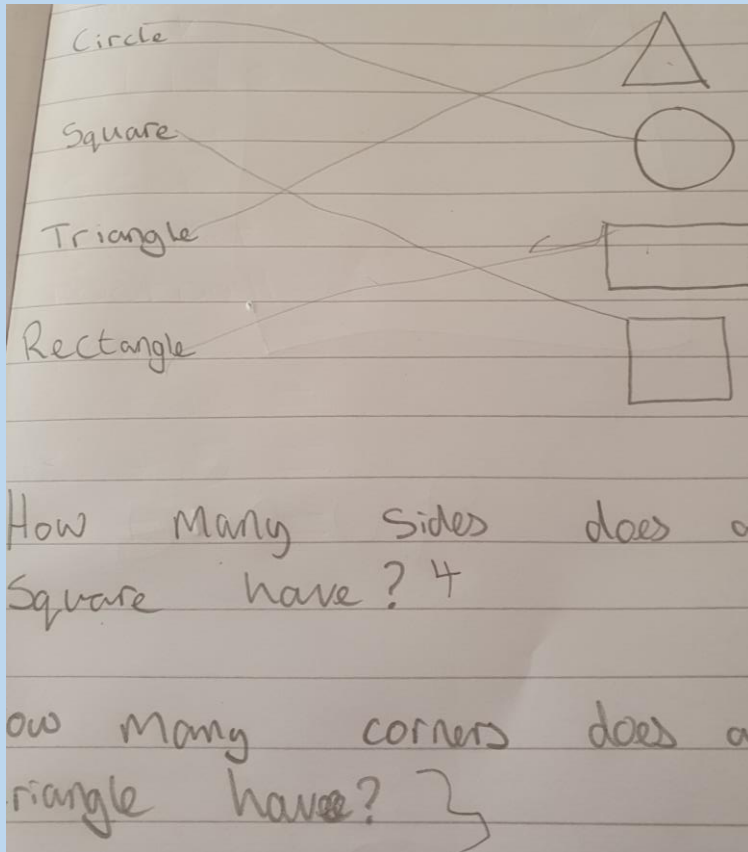
Mercedes Year 4,

### Odin

Odin is the king of the Aesir. He is the god of war, death, sky and wisdom. His wife is Frigg the goddess. He is the father of all the Nordic gods. His mind companions are two ravens two owls and a horse. His ravens tell him all the news from all around the world. He rides the flying 8-legged horse across the sky. He has a spear called Gungnir which never misses its mark. He sacrificed one eye to drink from the fountain of wisdom. He is the one that chooses who goes to Valhalla.

### Thor

He is the son of Odin and god of thunder. He rides in a chariot pulled by goats but sometimes he is very hungry and can't find anything to eat, he eats his goats! and then crosses them. He has a war hammer called Mjolnir, the strike of the hammer causes thunder. When it is thrown it returns to the owner. He protects Asgard and Midgard from giants. 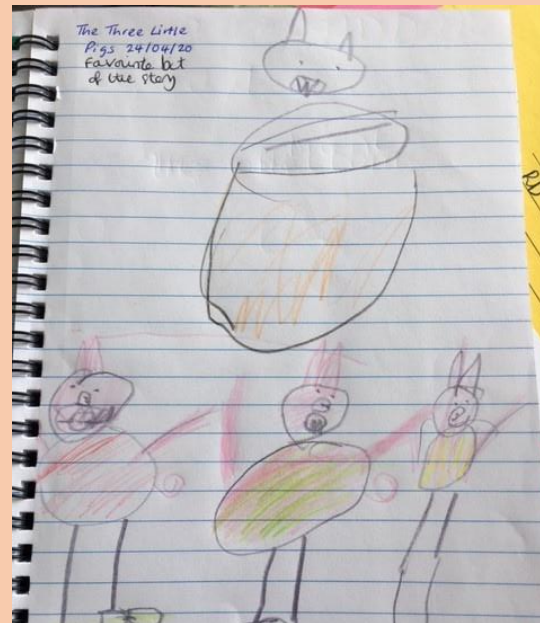


Archie Year 6,

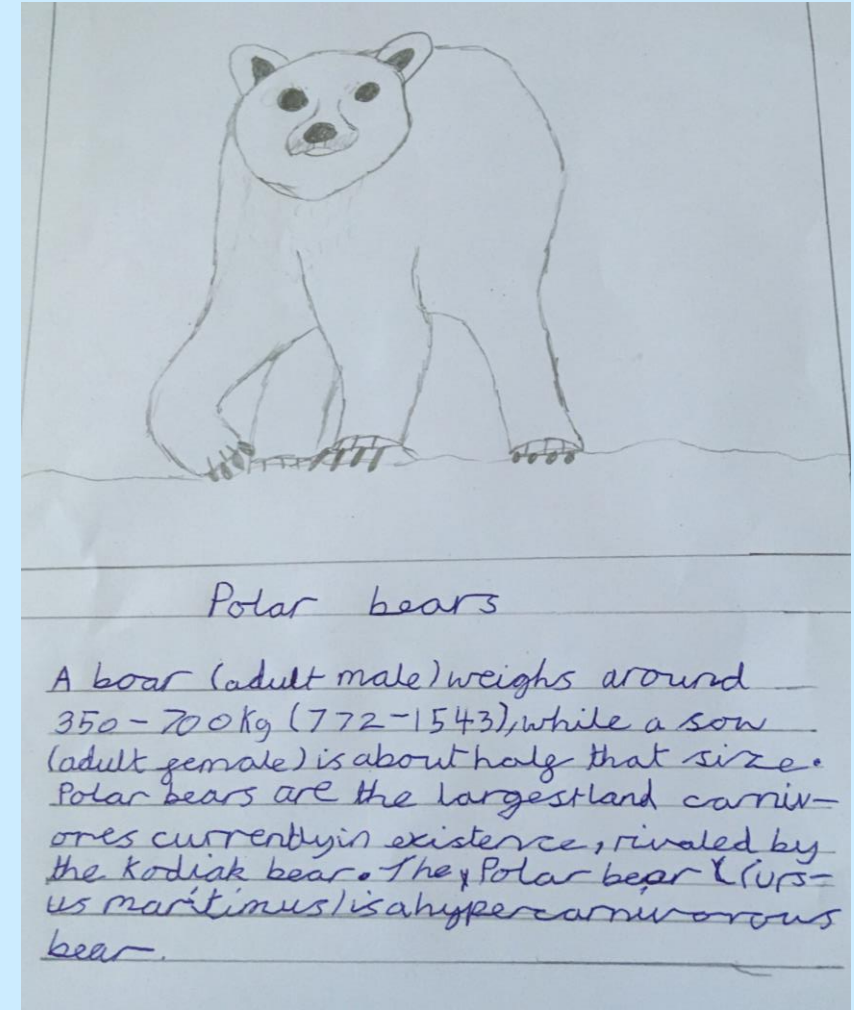




Mia-Bella Year 1,
