## PE AND SPORT PREMIUM BUDGET 2018-19

Grant allocation: £ 22,330

**OCTOBER 2018-** £13,025    **APRIL 2019 -** £9,304

The Government has doubled the sport premium grant for the academic year 2018-19 and schools are expected to use the funding to show additional and sustainable improvement in the following five areas:

- 1) **The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles**
- 2) **The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**
- 3) **Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport**
- 4) **Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**
- 5) **Increased participation in competitive sport**

The following budget has been planned to enable our school to make improvements in the areas indicated above as well as into improving the learning environments used for PESSPA. All allocations are subject to change and will be updated throughout the year. All spending allocations are expected to embed the 'healthy, active lifestyles' message.

Addressing gaps in maths knowledge and finding alternative ways to deliver maths will help raise attainment in a core subject, particularly amongst those pupils who need an alternative approach to learning. Buying T shirts in house colours for all pupils will raise the profile of the school values and further embed their impact on learning. A greater sense of unity amongst staff will also help to raise the profile of PE across the school.

Teachers will be able to identify pupils who have gaps in their learning and interventions such as fizzy can be put in place.

<b>Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils</b>	£1,000	Diversity & enrichment Football/streetdance/rugby boxing/cricket/tennis	Enriching the curriculum and extra curriculum offer is sustainable until 2020 via the Sports Premium and its legacy will be that more pupils will engage in a greater variety of activities into adulthood	The school provides enrichment experiences and school funded clubs that have a pathway to participation beyond school. Pupils are being signposted to clubs and external coaches have identified talented pupils. The school now has several links with NGB clubs in the community and there has been an increase in the number of pupils attending them. Sports wheelchairs will have a lasting impact on those pupils with inclusive needs. The chairs will also be used by able bodied children and will allow for greater diversity in the PE curriculum.

The school will provide access to over 40 inter school sports events this year, enabling the school to maintain the School Games Gold mark. Pupil who represent the school have been proud to do so and their success at district level has been noted. Intra school competition has been embedded into curriculum PE & encouraged more pupils to attend clubs. The 'values' based approach to School Games and sports days has enabled all pupils to be rewarded for achieving well, impacting on their engagement in PESSPA.
